

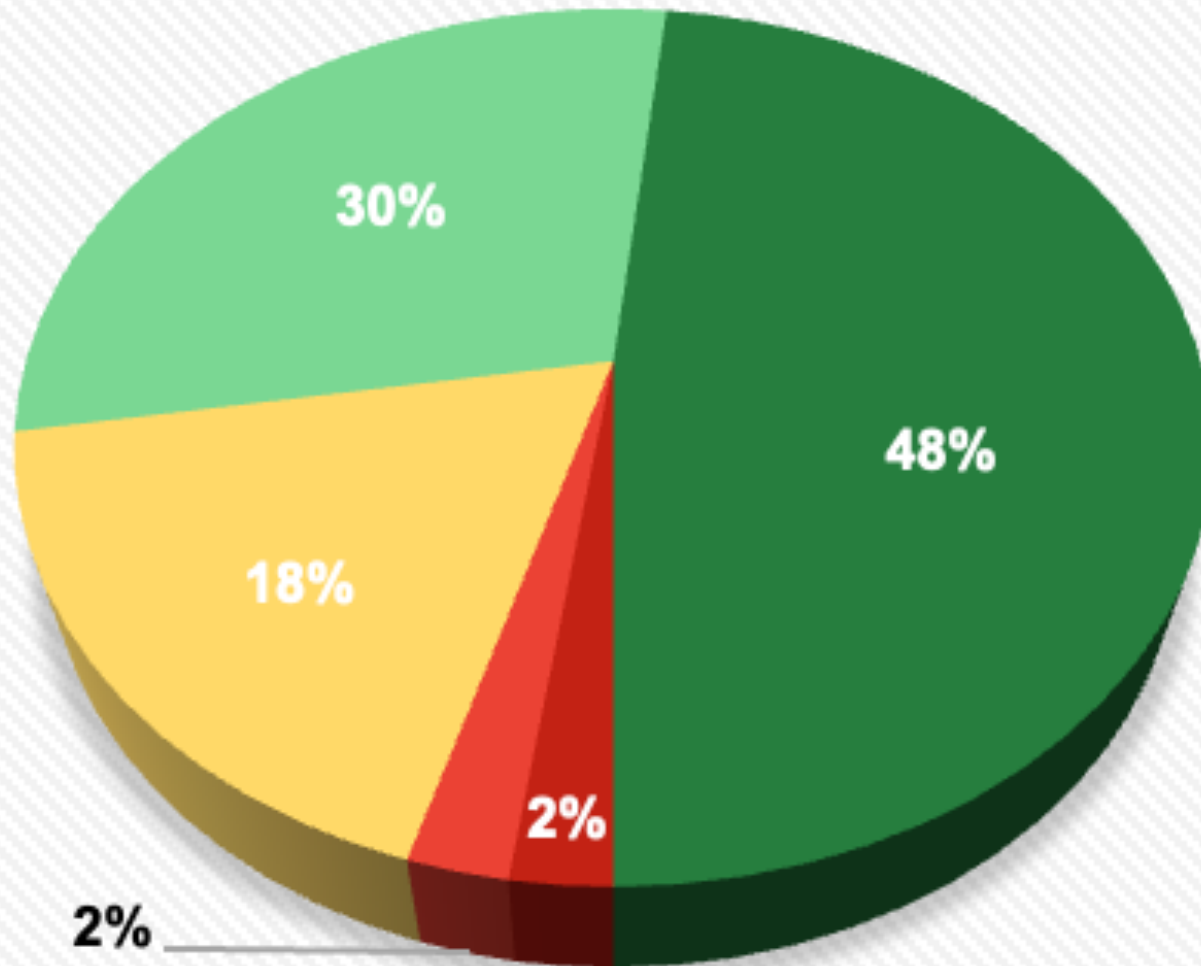
2023 Survey

- Articles of Incorporation state “purpose” of Organization is
 - *“To maintain and preserve mutually agreeable water levels...”*
- As of 1990 when ownership of the dam was transferred, mutually agreeable levels (based on historical levels) were:
 - In-Season range of 17 – 20 inches
 - Off-Season maximum of 24 inches
 - TPIA conducted survey to see if these levels are still “mutually agreeable”

Survey Results

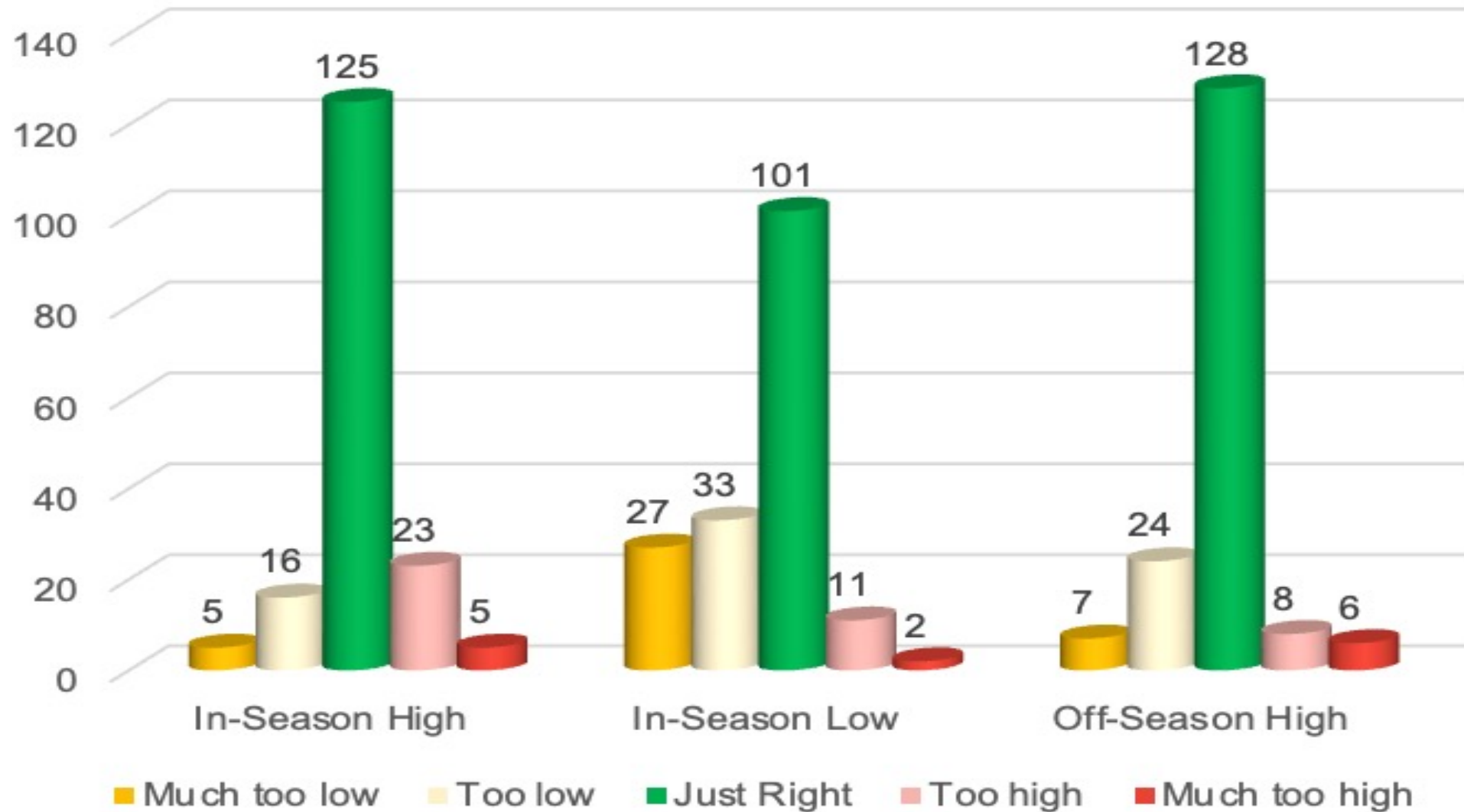
- Strong Response

10 Year Lake Level Satisfaction

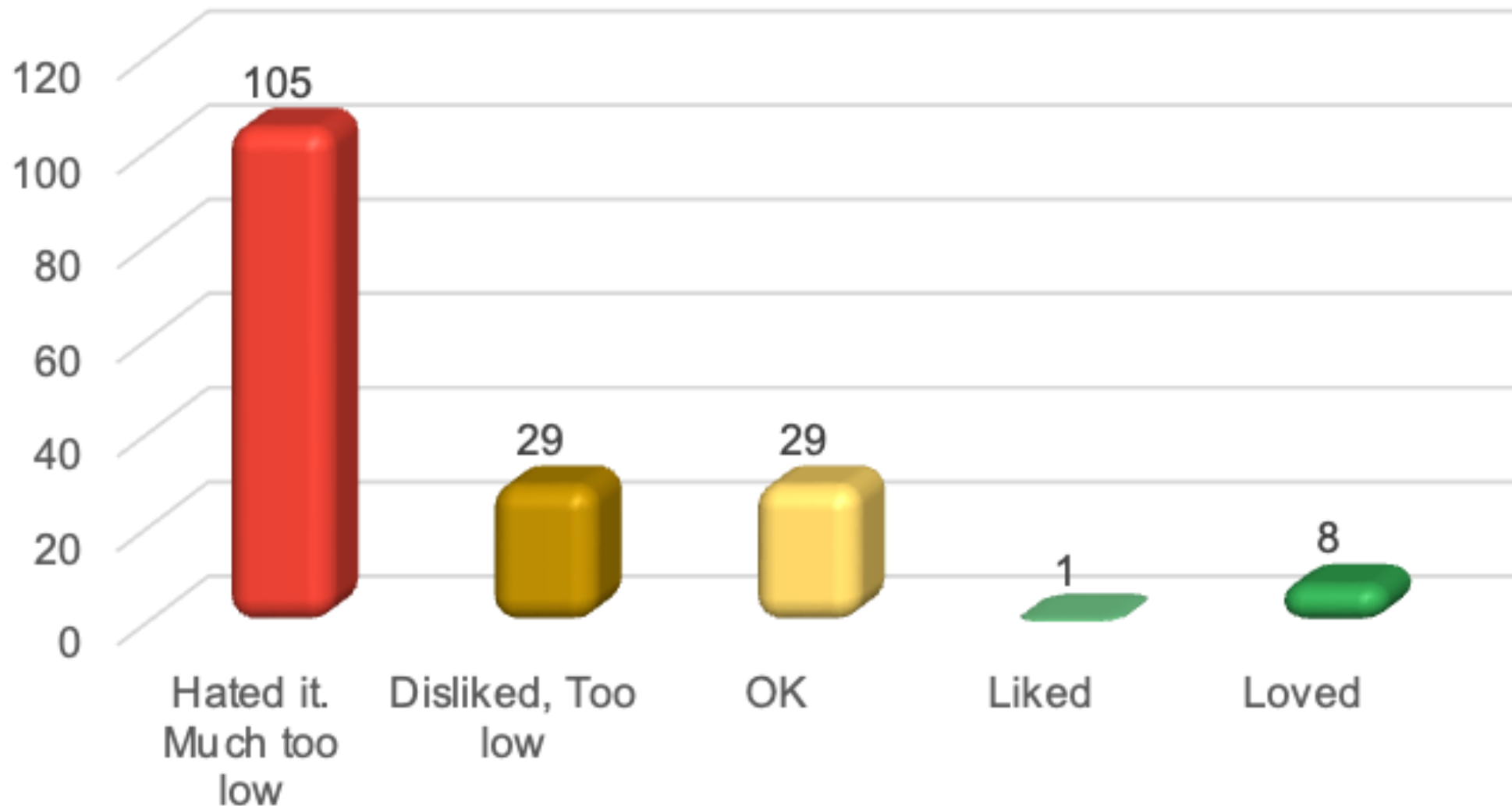


■ Hate ■ Dislike ■ OK ■ Like ■ Love

Perception of Lake Levels



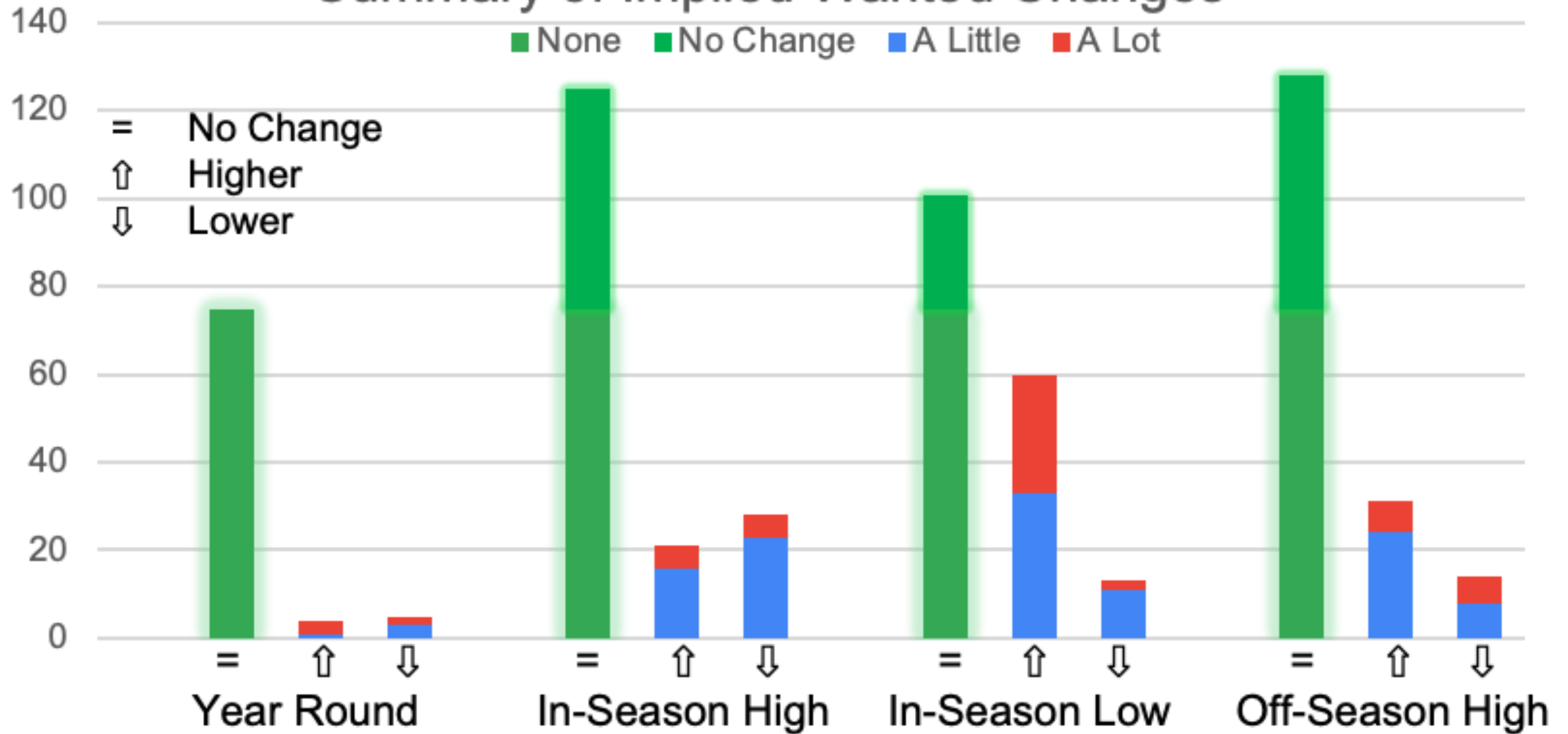
Extreme Drawdown (Dis)Satisfaction

Key Results

- Existing defined pond levels are still “mutually agreeable”
- A very small percentage want across-the-board or major changes
- For the minority who want a change, more generally favor increasing pond levels than reducing them, **but**
 - slightly more people would prefer a lower In-Season high than an increase
 - almost 1/3 prefer a higher In-Season low
- Residents strongly disliked the extreme drawdown of 2022

Our Takeaways for the Management Plan

- Keep existing Thomas Pond level targets the same
- Establish an off-season low level target
- Be somewhat more aggressive in avoiding and responding to water level above target, but don't do so in a way that causes the Pond to drop below the target levels
